Safety and Security Measures

Statement of Expectation

We will diligently work to make every effort to ensure the safety and security of all children. Children will experience activities that enhance spiritual development and academic excellence in a fun and social environment. Children will also have the opportunity to participate in many off-site, local and out of town field trips that will be educational and fun. We will not subject our children, camp counselors, guest presenters, or volunteers to children who display behavior that is disrespectful, disruptive, and/or uncontrollable. Appropriate disciplinary actions will be taken and documented to ensure everyone has a safe, educational, and fun summer camp experience.

Emergency Measures

Consolidated Baptist Church has an emergency management plan in the event of fire and tornado emergencies. An overview of those plans will be reviewed with the children on DAY 1 of Summer Camp. Both the Children's Ministry Leader and Camp Coordinator have CPR and First Aid Certifications. All camp counselors and teachers will be required to attend CPR certification classes, if not already certified.

Staff and Supervision

Our camp staff is comprised of adult and youth workers, and a background check has been performed on each and every staff member. Adult workers will be teaching, transporting, and/or supervising all children and youth workers. Camp counselors will be at least 16 years of age. They will assist with teaching activities, monitoring hallways, serving meals, conducting recreational activities, and maintaining a clean environment.

Accident/ Injury Report

The safety and security of our children is important to everyone participating with our camp. In the event that a child receives a minor injury (cut, scrape, bite, etc.), an accident report will be filled out by the supervising staff member and/or the Camp Coordinator. One copy of this report will be given to the child's parent, and another copy will be placed in the child's file.

Children

For the purpose of academic instruction and traveling to/from field trips, children will be divided into age appropriate groups.

Behavior Management

All children are expected to behave in a respectable manner that is pleasing to God. The standard of behavior for the CBC Summer Camp parallels classroom standards. Children are expected to respect the staff and to follow the rules. All rules are directed towards avoiding injury to persons or property while ensuring fairness.

To insure a safe, courteous, and positive environment, it is necessary to firmly deal with unacceptable behavior. A disruptive child may be removed from a group situation or denied a privilege in order to help him/her regain self-control. Any form of discipline that would diminish a student's self-respect or self-esteem is avoided.





If a child's behavior endangers another child's or staff's well-being, is destructive, or is disrespectful to authority, he/she will be given a discipline referral, and a copy will be given to his/her parent. In the event that the camp coordinator deems it necessary, parents may be called to pick up the child immediately. Three discipline referrals during the summer will result in the child being dismissed from camp.

Please help us provide a safe environment for all students and staff by emphasizing appropriate behavior at home and by supporting the CBC Summer Camp staff in the event that a discipline problem arises. Our goal is to assist children in learning to accept responsibility for their actions. We hope that we can provide rewards and consequences that foster good behavior. Behavior management is a day-to-day lesson in learning to make Godly choices, while learning how to interact positively with both children and adults.

Civility Policy

It is the intent of the CBC Summer Camp to provide a positive environment for socialization, as well as learning. To that extent, every adult that comes through the doors becomes a role model for positive socialization skills and effective problem management. CBC Summer Camp reserves the right to deny service to any child whose family members or associates do not exhibit the appropriate behavior for an environment of Christian growth and learning. All parents and associates are reminded that displays of anger, inappropriate behavior, and physical abuse can result in the termination of services to the entire family. CBC Summer Camp staff reserves the right to determine what constitutes an infraction. Swearing, threatening gestures, raised voices, and intoxication are several good examples. Serious infractions may be referred to the proper authorities.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up

Procedure

Transportation to and from camp is the responsibility of the parents/guardians. Our doors will open at 7:30 a.m. This year we will be using the front door entrance of CBC for pick up and drop off. The front entrance will be locked at 9:00 a.m. All children, parents, and visitors arriving after 9:00 a.m. will need to press the "CALL" button on the keypad to the right of the door. Children will not be released to anyone other than those persons listed on the registration form, **unless written authorization is submitted to the Children's Ministry Leader and/or the Camp Coordinator at least 24 hours in advance.** All children should be picked up before 5:30 p.m.

Extended Care and Late Penalties

Extended care is offered between 5:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. at a flat rate of \$10.00 per child per day. **Payment will be due the same day the child is picked up.** Those arriving after 5:35 p.m., who have not made arrangements in advance for extended care, **will be charged \$2.00 per minute between 5:35 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.** The child will not be permitted to return to camp until all late fees have been paid. Parents, who have not made arrangements for extended care and routinely arrive after 5:35 p.m., will be asked to withdraw their child(ren) from camp. A refund will NOT be issued for the remaining weeks.

Church Activities

At Consolidated, we welcome all of our camp participants to join us in our various ongoing activities. These Activities include Wednesday evening worship and Vacation Bible School. If your family participates in such church activities, your child still needs to be picked up by 5:30 p.m. **The above policy does not change,**





because of children's or youth activities that begin at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday evening or other church activities.

Educational Experience

Discipleship

The summer camp at Consolidated Baptist Church is a Christian education experience. Children will be taught the Word of God as presented in the Bible. Our emphasis will be on teaching Scripture through Bible stories, life application, and worship. Children will also participate in creative worship through liturgical dance and drama. These lessons will be fun and enjoyable.

Academic Development

The CBC summer camp will provide academic instruction in the areas of math, science, and literacy. The instruction will be provided by either college students/graduates or teachers in the field of education. Other instruction may also be provided by local community organizations that offer programming for school-aged children.

Recreation and Transportation

There will be a total of five off-site field trips over the course of the summer, and our campers will be transported by licensed transportation companies. Parents are welcome to attend field trips with their children. However, parents must provide their own transportation and pay the appropriate admission fees.

Parental Notification

A weekly notification will be published to inform parents about what we are doing spiritually, academically, and recreationally. We will also include information about local activities that may be of interest to you and your family.

Meals

Breakfast, Lunch, and Snack

Breakfast, lunch, and a snack are included in the camp fees. Breakfast is served from 7:40 a.m. - 8:25 a.m. Lunch is served from 12:00 p.m. - 12:45 p.m., and a snack is provided between 4:00 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. Please note that these times are subject to change. Additionally, parents will need to provide a sack lunch for their children on field trip days, unless otherwise noted.

Food Allergies/Special Diets

If your child is unable to eat the food provided through the summer camp due to food allergies, special dietary needs, or other reasons, please send an appropriate lunch and snack for him/her. **Please send all food in a disposable lunch bag, and write your child's name and the date on it.**

Personal Items

Valuables

Valuable, personal items, such as toys, electronics, collector cards, etc., should not be brought to camp. The camp is not responsible for damages to person property or lost/stolen items. All other personal items should be clearly marked with your child's name. Please make every effort to ensure your child's belongings are with them at departure. We also recommend that you check the lost and found at the end of each day. At the end of





camp, all unclaimed items will be donated to charity. Our summer camp is not responsible for damage to or loss of personal property.

Suggested Clothing

Children should dress according to the weather. Additionally, we recommend that children wear comfortable clothing, that you will not mind if it gets soiled. Since we will be moving, walking, and running, we do not recommend the following items for children: skirts, flip flops, or open toe shoes. We do recommend the following items: appropriate length shorts, pants, and tennis shoes. Proper footwear ensures that children avoid injury. A backpack containing swimwear, a towel, and water shoes or flip flops is necessary on days when children will be swimming. When it rains, please provide your child with a poncho/raincoat and appropriate shoes. Please do not send an umbrella.

Illness

Illness

Our summer camp cannot provide services for sick children. Please do not send your child to camp, if he/she is ill. We are concerned for the health and well-being of each child. Therefore, we require that your child be picked up as soon as possible, in the event that he/she becomes ill. In order to return, you may be required to provide a doctor's note stating that the illness is not contagious. These illnesses include, but are not limited to, conjunctivitis (pink eye), head lice, and the flu.

Allergies

We understand that some children may have summer allergies. Please note on your application any allergies, symptoms, and medications taken.
